If my people....

I could have gone for the "out with the old, in with the new" or "new year new leaf". Maybe a motto text to be stuck on the pin board? Then again, I could go for the article that reflects on the past year's events and attempts to foresee the year to come. Er, perhaps not....

Instead, I'm going to quote a sentence from the Old Testament to encourage us to pray.

Solomon had been praying on behalf of the people he reigned over and knowing they would fall into sin asked God to hear when they prayed and to forgive them. God's reply is a stand-out verse: *'If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and forgive their sin and will heal their land'* (II Chronicles 7v14). The wayward nation would face drought, famine, or plague as part of God's discipline, but if humble will be restored.

It's wrong for a modern nation to take the title 'God's own people.' It was never intended to be applied this way. It was on the day of the Temple dedication that king Solomon had been praying according to God's will and now he intercedes for the people. He repeatedly asks the Lord to hear his peoples' prayers and be merciful, to change their hearts and return them to the way of righteousness. God's reply underlined how troubles arise from sin, while humble repentance leads to restoration. Sure, He'll answer Solomon's prayer, because Solomon has been praying according to the Lord's will.

It is in fact a powerful reminder that we are given an assurance about prayer being heard: *'This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him'* (1 John 1v14-15).

It is an even greater reminder that we have one who intercedes for us in heaven: *'Now the main point of what we are saying is this: We do have such a high priest, who sat down at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, and who serves in the sanctuary, the true tabernacle set up by the Lord, not by a mere human being'* (Hebrews 8v1).

Let's make 2022 a year in which we diligently pray according to God's will and expect Him to answer accordingly.

Hope Explored

As the weeks pass I continue to observe and experience new things (at Royal Stoke and County Hospitals) which I hope you find both interesting and encouraging.

Even with the huge additional expenditure incurred because of the pandemic, standards continue to improve – wards are being redecorated and improved both when empty and (most considerably) while still occupied by patients.

I have seen the introduction of different coloured aprons in some areas such that a specific colour should be worn in a particular 4 or 5 bedded bay; although a new apron is always worn for each patient, this acts as an additional prompt to replace PPE when moving to different areas around the ward.


I have been sent to visit patients and on arrival found 'a purple bow' on their door. This means that the person within is now in the last stages of life which may not have been the case when they were last visited. If I find this, my task is to report back immediately when an ordained chaplain will visit as soon as possible.

I have been having greater interaction with ward staff – perhaps because of the extra work load they have – and on occasion they too value the opportunity to talk with me.

I was asked in the run up to Christmas to accompany other members of the SPaRC team onto wards to play the concertina and pre-recorded carols (unfortunately live carolling was not possible this year) to share the real meaning of Christmas with patients and staff alike.

I can only say that the longer I am doing this work the more rewarding it is. I hope that it is beneficial for patients also.

Their healthcare options are limited, putting those who are pregnant at severe risk. Pray for their protection, for safe births and for healing from trauma. Ask God to make a way to rebuild and restore what's been lost in the earthquake.
10th	Give thanks to God that, here in the UK, we have the opportunity to receive a third booster jab. Yet vaccine inequality continues to be a major problem worldwide. Please continue to pray for the people who are suffering around the world because of this pandemic.
11th	Please keep in your prayers the people of Ethiopia. Conflict continues between armed groups and government forces across the country. Millions of people have fled their homes and the violence has caused serious food shortages. Pray for tensions to de-escalate and for peace and reconciliation among all Ethiopians. Pray for safety, and for provision of food and shelter for those in need.
12th	Ask God to resolve the problems in Afghanistan that are leading to the rising costs of everyday items, so that even more people are not pushed further into poverty. Pray for strength, energy and resources for our partners in Afghanistan as they navigate reaching people in need while the country remains in conflict.

Jigsaw awarded a grant of \$5000

Jigsaw has been awarded a grant of US\$5000 for emergency food for children and families from PayPal Philippines.

The Bible is full of wonderful stories of how God uses people to guide His work and His mission and the same happens in the world today and this is the story of how Jigsaw came to be a recipient of \$5000 from PayPal.

Jessica is a team leader in Jigsaw and early in November a friend of hers who works for PayPal Philippines asked her if Jigsaw had applied for the PayPal \$5000 US dollar challenge. Jessica asked for some information and application forms and passed them on to Jeannette Jigsaw's director. Finding out more, Jeannette learnt that PayPal Philippines were looking to find 5 organisations in the Philippines to give a donation of \$5000 dollars to for emergency relief programmes for children in need. Jeannette, Jenalyn and others spent hours filling in forms, providing photos of evidence, writing project briefs and gathering testimonials from recipients of Jigsaw's services. Finally it was submitted in the beginning of November, and then we all began to pray.

Congratulations Jigsaw

Then just this week, Jigsaw heard the very exciting news that it had been chosen as one of 5 organisations out of hundreds of applicants to win one of the 5 places to receive the \$5000 US dollar grant! Jeannette couldn't believe it as she said the other four organizations chosen were very prestigious with their CEO's being well known and often on TV. So although Jigsaw is small in comparison to the other organisations it was recognized for it's amazing work with the urban poor. Wow Praise God. The grant will be used to provide emergency food packs for 1600 of the neediest children and 750 families. We look forward to updating you on the project as it is implemented. Praise God for Jessica's friend who connected Jigsaw to the PayPal initiative. THANK YOU for your prayers, this is a direct answer to our prayers for funds to come from the Philippines

A new focus on Varaždin Church

Earthquake disaster zone, Petrinje, 40 miles south of Zagreb

It was so sad to visit the people in this town and its surrounding areas. It looks just like a big bomb had flattened a housing area. Throughout the countryside houses here and there are destroyed, in shambles. The church has "adopted" 5 displaced families and we visited them. One family has attended the church's camp on the coast and driven 100 miles to our church in Varaždin. The young family is overjoyed to be with Christian fellowship. "It was worth the earthquake, just to bring us here", the wife and mother exclaimed at a church lunch a week ago. Pray them to deep and real faith and also, that they and many can be back in real houses and not in their containers. It was humbling as Tabita and I (Stephen) met with many of them. The church has undertaken to visit regularly and deliver packets of food.

Lausanne Networking, Exponential

We have seen that there is a great need for churches and pastors to share the stresses and joys of the Great Commission together. Encouragement, hope, praying together and also training and evangelising together; this is what Europe (or the World) needs. In October I represented the Croatian church at the Exponential meetings in Berlin, where 100 leaders from all over Europe (east and west) met and planned. November 17th Kostya, my Ukrainian Colleague, and I drove 400km to Split to meet with some 10 church pastors and elders and introduce them to Norwegian pastor Øivind Augland (Exponential leader) and link Croatia into the wider European scene. We discussed how God could lead us in the future. Øivind had just visited Albania for and was able to attend the huge celebrations of 30 years of the Gospel in Albania. I remember being amongst the first 120 missionaries to evangelise Tirana in July 1991, when the first church was started. The Gospel is truly powerful and joyous! Ding Nguk Gie is the daughter of the Arch-deacon of Foochow, she is now in the second year of the Foochow Middle School and getting on very well.

Our school children are asked to bring more money for her support, for the Chinese Dollars which used to cost 1s. 9d. now cost 5/1d because exchange is against us.

The health of the School has been good, but in Foochow City at least 8,000 people have died of cholera.
