

Results, worth and the love of God

During the last weeks the direction of many lives have changed. Our minds may reflect on the sporting achievements of the Commonwealth Games, the European athletics, or some other sporting events in the calendar – for there have been so many during the summer! But for many the outcome of exams has been uppermost on their minds. The anxious toil leading up to facing a sheet of questions, then sitting in silence furiously scribbling answers as the clock ticks by, with time disappearing quickly as the display knowledge and understanding has its moment.

The exam results have been revealed. For some there was disappointment and regret that grades were missed, and opportunities seem to have changed. For others there was delight and euphoria at achieving the desired marks or exceeding expectations. Family members commiserate or celebrate according to the outcome. It may be a time of grappling with deep issues of our sense of self-worth: the two extremes being to struggle to regain confidence, or to brim with pride.

The number and level of exams passed, the grades achieved, or the outcome of applications are not a measure of our worth. Our worth is discovered only in relation to God. Here is the assurance we need to hear, remember, and even be reminded of again and again. It concerns the issue of whether there is any trying circumstance or trial we face that can throw doubt on our value to God. The answer is a resounding 'no' given in a truly memorable way by the Apostle Paul: *'For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord'* (Romans 8v38-39).



Our sense of self-worth may be as changeable as the weather, but the great love of God in Jesus Christ is steadfast and true. With that in mind we can hold our heads up and face the future with this sure knowledge of God's commitment to his people.

How long has Christ Church magazine been running?

The oldest copy we have is this from January 1885, when the then vicar Walter Thompson wrote "*I hope our Parish Magazine will be welcomed by all. It will come as a friend once a month. I have long wished for this "missing link" to be forged*" - implying

that this was the first year of issue. However, it is Volume XV, Issue 1, so there must have been 14 more years of the magazine sometime between 1840 and 1885, so our church magazine has just reached 150 years of circulation!

Interestingly, the oldest church magazine is believed to be that of St Andrew's, Sonning, running since 1869. So ours may be a close second!

Harvest Festival – 25th September

As usual, the church is giving to Tearfund on Harvest Sunday, supporting their Harvest campaign

‘Help communities to flourish again.’

This focuses on the effects of the climate crisis on food supply in the developing world - either due to drought or flooding. The case study is Nepal, where crops are failing & families are going hungry. Mahima said ‘We kept looking at the sky hoping for rainfall - when we planted apples they would wither’. Our donations will help Tearfund partners to train farmers like Mahima in new farming techniques so they can free themselves from poverty.

In addition to donating to Tearfund on Harvest Sunday we’re taking part in The International Christian Food Bank (www.food.gives/gb) from 18th September to 9th October. This is a Barnabas Fund project which we supported in 2021 when the scheme was launched. We can give dried goods - from the list below

- chick peas
- lentils
- rice
- salt (packets please)
- wheat flour (wholemeal)

We will order a church box & also some family boxes. The goods will be distributed to hungry & persecuted Christians worldwide through Barnabas’ church partners. In 2022 food has been sent to Pakistan, Tonga, Ukraine & Zimbabwe. For more information, visit the website above.

	<i>Scripture Union—pray for work among young people</i>
1st	Give thanks for all the holidays that took place this summer and the volunteers who made them happen. Please pray for refreshment and encouragement for them as they go back to work and studies
2nd	Please pray about the new Holiday Club resource for churches to use in 2023—”Restoration Station”. Pray that the material will help young people learn about how Jesus is the Create Restorer
3rd	National Mission Partner “Festive” supports Christian Unions in colleges and universities. As students return this month, pray for CUs to be started and to grow
4th	Pray for the “Revealing Jesus” Sports Pioneers who have recently started work in northern England, as they seek to help churches reach out to young people
	<i>Stephen and Tabita Bell are planting churches in Croatia</i>
5th	Stephen and Tabita are working to establish regular church meetings in the nearby town of Novi Marof. £400 is needed each month to rent premises for the church. Some local people did attend church but meetings stopped during the pandemic
6th	Stephen writes “Emanuel and I have been motivated to write a book on the power of working together, with the view to encouraging people across denominations to co-operate wherever possible and, more to the point, refrain from criticism and competition.”
7th	Further integrated into the Varaždin church—Stephen and Tabita are now part of the leadership team here and are leading a housegroup
8th	Street evangelism during June attracted crowds to taste Brazilian food and listen to the choir singing in the town square. Many informal conversations took place with passers-by. Pray that some will begin to attend church meetings too.
	<i>TearFund works with many poor communities across the world. They especially work through local churches and agencies</i>

9th	In Uganda, partner EcoBrixx has set up plastic collection points near Lake Victoria which is now choked with plastics. EcoBrixx is extracting plastics from the lake by the tonne and employing local people to recycle them
10th	Jas Green Centre in Plateau state Nigeria, used 50,000 recycled plastic bottles in the construction of its new Youth Livelihood Centre which will support youth employment projects. Pray that this Centre which also recycles electronic waste into solar power units, will inspire further projects
11th	A new project in Nepal is providing bins for local families and training them to sort and manage plastic waste instead of burning it as many currently do. Pray for this project as it turns rubbish into marketable products such as bio briquettes for cooking, which reduces deforestation.
12th	Research shows that since the first Covid-19 lockdown in the UK, one third of young adults have watched or listened to a religious service, with many turning to prayer. Pray that young people in England will find a home within a church
	<i>Our CMS Link Missionaries Tim and Kate Lee helped to set up JigSaw Kids Ministries in Manila (Philippines). Please pray-</i>
13th	Jigsaw's Bible Holiday Club this year reached 2000+ children and young people, mostly through home packs as face-to-face activities were not possible due to Covid-19
14th	Jigsaw's new van will be delivered in September– pray that it will travel safely throughout the slums of Manila and reach children in need
15th	Give thanks for the Consuelo Foundation of the Philippines, which has given a large donation to Jigsaw enabling the purchase of resources for several projects. The Foundation is considering further funding for specific Jigsaw projects
16th	Although virus levels are relatively low at the moment, vaccinations have not reached high levels in Manila. As Jigsaw resumes face-to-face activities in November, pray that all will go well

	<i>Jonathan and Robinah Beesigomwe live in Gabarone, Botswana. Their organisation is “Bows and Arrows Ministry”, and they work with older schoolchildren and young adults.</i>
17th	54,000 scripture booklets and Christian books have just arrived; pray that these can be distributed in schools and other places where they will be welcomed and read
18th	Pray that the partnership with Scripture Union will help J&R as they visit schools
19th	The Scripture Union local director borrowed Jonathan’s car and unfortunately collided with a cow. He had minor injuries but the cow was killed and Jonathan’s car was badly damaged. Please pray.
20th	Farming education work continues with a focus on growing potatoes for food, as well as Safflower for commercial purposes
	<i>Mission Aviation Fellowship fly medical personnel, supplies and missionaries to far-flung, often inaccessible settlements.</i>
21st	MAF has identified several particularly isolated Christian communities in Madagascar. Pray that God will lead MAF to partners with a vision for sharing the gospel in areas that are spiritually barren
22nd	Praise God that funding has been found so that MAF eye safaris have resumed in Kenya after a 12 year hiatus, enabling many Kenyans to have their eyesight restored
23rd	MAF Kenya hopes to extend eye safaris to Kenyan regions Garissa, Isiolo, Lamu, Mandera, Marsabit, Tana River and Wajir. Pray that this vision to see even more people cured from blindness will become a reality

24th	Give thanks for the work of partners Christian Blind Mission and The Fred Hollows Foundation, who provide medics for the eye safaris. Pray for medical staff who spend long periods away from home and family to do this work
	<i>The Bible Society's Bible-a-month club is delivering Bible resources in England and Wales</i>
25th	Pray for the "Open the Book" project which takes Bible stories and enacts them for school children. Pray especially for the team at Christ Church, Stone (yes, us) working in our First Schools
26th	This year, 6,000 Bibles will be distributed free in British prisons. Many come to faith in prisons; pray that as they return to society, they will be able to leave behind their past life and start anew
27th	The Bible-a-month Club supports the annual National Parliamentary Prayer Breakfast. MPs, parliamentary staff and church leaders come together from across the country to pray and learn
28th	The Bible-a-month Club also helped launch "Navigating Trauma", a Scripture-based programme for people suffering because of violence, abuse, loss, grief or substance misuse. It helps them move towards a place of peace.
	<i>Church Mission Society works in many countries around the world</i>
29th	Isaac Goh is a local partner in Malaysia leading a cross-cultural mission training school for urban and rural students. Pray for Isaac as he recruits, trains and sends out people to make more disciples of Jesus
30th	Rosie and Stu Bayford are based in Recife, Brazil, where the new community market they have been working towards for months is now up and running, redistributing surplus food to local families. Praise God for the dedicated volunteers in the project, and pray that more supermarkets to come on board

Letter from Pearl Addobea Agykwa

(Pearl is a student at All Nation's Bible College and has been awarded this year's bursary from a fund set up using some of the money from a legacy left by Cecilia Wilding to Christ Church Stone)

I trust that you are well by the sufficient Grace of God. I am Pearl Addobea Agyakwa, from Ghana, West Africa, a single (unattached) lady in my thirty's. Committed to the cause of Jesus Christ and the establishment of His Kingdom. I believe the Bible to be the complete Word of God and seek to fulfil the call of discipleship and reaching out to many, as commissioned in Matthew 28:19-20 by the Lord Jesus Christ as a mandate. I served in Ghana as a youth minister for 7 years and a volunteer prayer secretary in Christian Youth Oriented Organisation Known as Christ for Youth International (C.Y.I) and a volunteer mentor to its Senior High Schools program known as "Campaign for Greatness".

I additionally participated in evangelistic mission trips with another ministry (Harvest Missions for Souls) a no denominational mission wing of Harvest International ministries from the year 2014 to 2019. I was a constant participant in all our mission trips in most parts of Ghana and West Africa. Most of these travels were to underprivileged areas where the Gospel of Jesus was presented, along with medical missions.

In September 2019, the Lord led me to join an international charity organization here in the United Kingdom as a volunteer youth minister /worker for a church in Surrey. As part of my role, I helped in building discipleship groups and helped other youth networks engage in community projects and activities. After my contract with the organization ended, my passion for the young people grew stronger as I realized how mentoring helped change behaviours, social networks, and develop the skills and competencies of young people.

With constant prayer and the Lord's leading I aimed to pursue a degree programme that will expand my knowledge in God and build my skills and creativity in training and disciplining young people. *(continued)*

I was connected to All Nations Christian College in the year 2020 as a recommendation from a cross-cultural missionary and started a 3-year program in Biblical and intercultural studies. Being a part of the College last year has provided me a distinctive opportunity to learn and serve young people cross-culturally. As part of my course, I am partnering with a local church (Newlife Church Palmers Green) in a ministry placement, where I serve as a leader in the Youth group, young adults' group and working with a vast range of cultures who come on Friday evenings and Sundays.

Not only is it a wonderful place to learn and serve, but also a place to put the things I am learning into practice. I am excited at where our Heavenly Father is leading me, to experience this journey in building His Kingdom across nations. As He has never failed us in anyway, I am continually encouraged to trust in Him as I walk this path with Him Knowing He will provide each step of the way. I look forward to serving in Newlife church after college and whenever the Lord opens another door, I am happy to follow and trust His Leadings.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone at Christ Church Stone for your continued amazing support in funding me and praying for me. I deeply appreciate every bursary support and prayer; it means so much to me and reminds me of Paul's words:

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy for you" Philippians 1:3-4. God richly bless you all in all-sufficiency and may the church flourish and blossom unto His glory.

News items based on Tim & Kate's latest update letter:

Jigsaw is still operating an 'At Home' program. They had hoped to restart face to face ministry in July, but a survey showed that although Covid is now at much lower levels, the number of young adults and children who have been vaccinated is still very low. In order to keep them all safe we have opted to review the situation in September and hope to restart face to face ministry by November.

Jigsaw's Bible holiday club this year reached 2000+ children and young people. The theme was 'Kingdom Quest' and looked at the endurance of Moses, the courage of queen Esther, the hope with Joshua and Jericho and life eternal with Jesus. The week was mostly done through home packs with craft, bible verses and scripture activities for the children and families to do.

Jigsaw staff give thanks for sufficient funds to buy a new van, but due to the world's present haulage/shipping situation there is currently limited stock of the Mitsubishi Vans in Manila, which means Jigsaw's new van will not be delivered before September.

A very significant answer to prayer is the generous grant given to Jigsaw, in June, by the Filipino-based Consuelo foundation, that supports work for children and families living in extreme poverty in Manila. After being invited to apply for funds, Jigsaw began the process of application which required much form filling and information to be sent over a 3-month period. The grant has enabled Jigsaw to buy an industrial photocopier and a years worth of toner and paper, 20 Samsung tablets for our literary program, therapy resources worth £3000 for Jigsaw's Children with disabilities program and 3 laptops for our admin team. This is such a significant partnership as getting funds from within the Philippines is not easy. The other exciting news is that Consuelo foundation are interested in funding one of Jigsaw's ministries for the longer term and plan to visit Jigsaw over the next 2 months to see if this is something they would like to do.

Training is a big part of Jigsaw's continuing development, so the Jigsaw team leaders are setting aside the next three months to review and develop Jigsaw's programs and ministries ready for a face to face restart of ministries in November. Please pray for God's wisdom, guidance and leading as the whole team set this time apart to develop and strengthen their various ministries.

Please continue to pray regularly for Tim, the Jigsaw Kids' Ministries team, and the children, young people and families with whom the teams share God's love and offer support in so many ways. A Day at the Seaside

We had a day out in Llandudno. It was a beautiful Saturday and we enjoyed our climb up the Igam Ogam (zigzag summit path) and the stroll down to the North Shore in the town. The views were stupendous with blue horizon melting into blue sea, birds dancing in the air and a profusion of wild flowers. The blues of the spring flowers vied with the yellow of lady's slipper and rock roses. Towering above these tiny flowers the yellow gorse scented the wind with coconut.

The walk was wonderful and we decided to walk the length of the town and climb the Little Orme. We realised on the way how much we needed a rest, a drink and something to eat. How glad we were to find a little bakery which sold drinks and had some outdoor seating. We were very grateful for the refreshment and the rest before we tackled the Little Orme, maybe much smaller than the Great Orme but it is a tougher walk.

It all brought to mind Psalm number 23. We felt restored and what a wonderful Psalm 24 to follow which begins "*The Earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein: for he has founded it upon the seas and established it upon the rivers*" *Enid*

Imagine that today you saw a baker placing yeast, still carefully sealed in its plastic bag, in a bread mixture. He explained that he did this "to keep the yeast pure and safe". It's a crazy thought. We all know that the yeast has to be thoroughly mixed into the dough to be of any use.

Jesus emphasised this in his parable about the Kingdom of God He describes a woman baking bread. "*The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough*". (Matthew 13:33).

The Christian Church is the earthly agent for the Kingdom of God and we are like little grains of kingdom yeast within it. To be effective we must be like the yeast in the parable – Not carefully wrapped up but out there mixing in the vast dough of society.

"Windsor Castle, July 10, 1893".

"The Queen wishes once again to express to her people how much gratified and touched she has been by the great loyalty and devotion to herself and her family which have been so strikingly evinced on the occasion of the marriage of her beloved grandson, the Duke of York, and his dear bride, the Princess Victoria Mary of Teck.

"It is, indeed, nothing new to the Queen, for in weal or woe she has ever met with the warmest, kindest sympathy, which she feels very deeply. She knows that the people of her vast Empire are aware how truly her heart beats for them in all their joys and sorrows ; and that in the existence of this tie between them and herself lies the real strength of the Empire.

"With them the Queen joins in fervent prayer and wishes for the welfare and happiness of her dear grandchildren.

Christ Church 129 years ago

Celebration of a Royal Wedding

I am able to put in a few words this month about the Royal Wedding; an event which has called forth from all classes in the country an amount of enthusiasm nearly equalling the year of the Queen's Jubilee. And, indeed, we have cause to rejoice in hope at the prospect which it opens out to us. At the Jubilee we looked back on the past; at the Royal Wedding we look forward into the future; and when we know that the Royal Bride and Bridegroom have already given proof that their aim in life is to serve God faithfully, and promote the highest good of all classes in our country, I say, we have cause to rejoice at the prospect. It means a continuance in high places of those virtues which have made the Queen loved as the Great Mother of her people. In Stone, the hearty and loyal character of the celebration gave general satisfaction. There was gladness on every hand, whether we consider the 400 aged poor entertained at luncheon in the Town Hall, or the children and young people numbering nearly 2,000 who with flags and banners walked in grand procession to the Common Plot. The scene there was one to be remembered. The great gathering of all around the Royal Standard to sing the National Anthem, the sports at different parts of the field, the gathering to the several centres for tea, and the general effect of bands, tents, children and parents made a most pleasing and animated picture.

I am glad to say that so far as our responsibilities at Christ Church went, everything passed off smoothly. The lady teachers had worked mightily the evening before in preparing provisions for 580 scholars. The day remained beautifully fine and closed without a hitch. The general arrangements and the character of local celebration did honour to Stone and was worthy the occasion.

Evangelism in Croatia 2022

Hello again from Varaždin, Croatia! We have just completed two main activities, the evangelistic weekend in Varaždin and the Church's one-week camp on the Croatian coastline.

Evangelism in Varaždin June 10th to 12th

It was so good to see 3 churches combine and get out on the streets to proclaim the love and authority of Jesus to people who would otherwise never have had contact with the Gospel. Each evening concerts were held, with some hundreds listening each time. During the day we had free use of a square in the town centre, where we had bookstands, open air preaching, singing, face painting as well as street evangelism. On one of our three stalls, we invited passers-by to taste original Brazilian food and drinks. I found it personally very helpful to chat to passers-by, invite them to the events, get them to taste some tasty «Brazilian» food and use the next 10-20 minutes sharing The Gospel. Tabita was also pretty dynamic at getting the crowds with her face painting, as she painted the faces of up to 30 children, advertising to the passing populace that something was afoot in town!

The Camp on the Coast

Some 70 of us spent a week together on a Croatian island, which was wonderful for us to develop friendships with the church members. Tabita helped speaking at a children's meeting and Stephen got to translate American pastor Carter speaking on Ecclesiastes. At the end of the camp we had a wonderful occasion, where Pastor Vlado's adopted son Igor was baptised. He was so touched during the camp that he reinforced his decision to follow Jesus Christ.

NOVI MAROF – Establishing a churchplant

This Autumn, we are seriously looking at establishing regular meetings, ministry and outreach in this nearby town, just 10 miles south of Varaždin. Since 2011 premises had been rented, regular church meetings and many evangelistic events were fully underway, but everything ceased during the Covid lockdowns. Now we are renewing our efforts with determination. Please pray for Jonatan and us who will be greatly responsible for preaching and music, amongst other things. Please pray also that God would provide the monthly rent of £400 for the church and most of all, pray for implementation and that God would bless us with real treasure: souls saved for Heaven. *Stephen and Tabita Bell*
