


The dawn of redeeming grace

Several books have been produced to help us prepare for Christmas. We have one on the go for the next few weeks entitled 'the dawn of redeeming grace'. It is a great title. For the breaking of a new day is something that cheers the soul!

Our churches are reading this book: it has just a couple of pages per day. It covers Christmas as reported by Matthew's Gospel, which starts with an introduction that is like an episode of the TV show 'Who do you think you are?'. For it begins with an extensive family tree. Matthew is concise in his report of the birth of Jesus and so didn't include all the same details as Luke (such as news about John the Baptist being born, the census that led to a long journey, the visiting shepherds). Matthew has been at his editor's desk and the resulting concise birth narrative enables key truths to stand out even more clearly.

This daily devotional guide for the season of Advent covers the four weeks leading up to Christmas – to refresh and inspire us as we reflect on the real story of the birth of Jesus Christ. Our course our focus on the first coming of Jesus Christ leads to a lot of preparatory work for our festive celebrations: we have trees, turkeys, and tinsel to plan. But another meaning of Advent is Jesus' second coming, or return, which is no less important.

So, why is Matthew's account important? What is his message that we should tune into?

At the end of Matthew's family tree, we discover why the advent of Christ is so important. Matthew records the angel's message to Joseph which is good news: *'She [talking about betrothed Mary] will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins'* (Matthews 1v21).

Jesus came to bring the salvation of the Lord. He will save people not merely in the physical sense (as when he calmed the storm to save his disciples lives), but in the most fundamental sense because he will bring salvation from sins. As sinners in a fallen world, estranged from our Creator as rebels without a cause, we see in Jesus that God has shown his mercy and forgiveness. Jesus fulfilled the promise of 'God with us' and provides salvation for all who repent and believe in him. It is this alone that can prepare us for his second advent, on a future day but with an unknown date. On that day Jesus will come as Judge of all and save those who are his people into his eternal kingdom.

Christmas is an annual reminder of the future day to prepare for. Are you ready? Have you seen the beginning of the dawn of a new day?

We'd love to see our readers at our Christmas celebrations. Look out for the special Christmas cards we are posting with service details.

Roger tells of a moment and a lesson never to be forgotten

In the Autumn of 1996 Sally and I were in our then partner diocese of Sarawak engaged in a teaching tour, arranged by Bishop Keith and Bishop Made Katib. Towards the end of our stay, the Archdeacon of North Sarawak and Brunei, Bolly Lapok (who later became Archbishop of the Province of South East Asia) insisted that Sally and I visited the parish of Niah.

In Niah we found the vicar's wife, hard at work in her kitchen cleaning pieces of translucent bird's nest material. This solidified saliva from swiftlets is made into bird's nest soup which is a very expensive delicacy indeed. The swiftlets nested in their thousands in the caves at Niah. The Rev Rentrapp was not only vicar of the parish but also a qualified guide for the caves, and when he offered to take us round we eagerly accepted.

The Great Cave is the third largest in the world. As we entered the cave we could just see in the semi darkness fragile bamboo poles and frameworks stretching high into the ceiling. Mr Rentrapp said men risked their lives collecting the nests using these flimsy structures. Then he simply said "Follow me" and we moved further into the darkness.

After a while, we came to a narrow path with a rock face to the right and a drop down to the left. There were tiny orange lights on the floor below, which I assumed were made by some sort of glowworm-like insect. "Stay very close to me" urged our guide, as we peered over the edge. I asked him what the lights were. He told me they were small fires lit by men digging the fertilizer guano (bird and bat droppings) at ground level. There was a sheer drop of hundreds of feet to the cave floor below!

Suddenly I wanted to stay very much closer to our guide than before!

"Swiftlet Bird's Nest | Eye On Malaysia 3"

Jesus would often say to people "Follow me" and those two simple words take me back our adventure. The memory of our visit to the "Great Cave" at Niah is a personal parable making me realise that we cannot follow Jesus in a casual way. The journey through life is sometimes dark and dangerous, like our time in the Great Cave at Niah. Following Jesus step by step, means staying very close to Him, and obeying his instructions.

The last verse of J.E.Bodes hymn "O Jesus I have promised to serve thee to the end" sums this up well.

Oh, let me see Thy footmarks,
And in them plant mine own;
My hope to follow duly
Is in Thy strength alone.
Oh, guide me, call me, draw me,
Uphold me to the end;
And then to rest receive me,
My Saviour and my Friend.

Now when I think of Jesus saying "follow me" I know it also means "Stay with me...stick close to me...trust me".

Only in this way can I be safe in the darkness and step into eternal light.

	<i>Matthew Leung work's with students at Keele University, Staffordshire University and Harper Adams College</i>
1st	Pray for the “Words of Life Day”, a day to equip and train students in delivering evangelistic talks themselves
2nd	Matthew will be speaking to students at Portsmouth Christian Union’s carol service on 7th December
3rd	Keele University’s Christian Union will hold a carol service on 12th December
4th	Pray that new Christian students will continue to get stuck in to the CUs. In particular do pray for more fresher guys at Keele, as we've currently only had 2 come! Pray also that Staffs will be able to have more students join them through out this term.
	<i>Stephen and Tabita Bell are planting churches in Croatia</i>
5th	3 days of street evangelism at the end of summer really informed Varaždin locals that the church is there! Face-painting, street food, games and talks attracted the attention of hundreds. Pray for those who heard the message
6th	Christmas concerts have been a big success in previous years, bringing many people into the churches to hear the choirs and music groups. Pray for good attendances again in 2022
7th	Further integrated into the Varaždin church—Stephen and Tabita are now part of the leadership team here and are leading a housegroup
8th	Stephen and Tabita suffered from Covid again at the end of October (they had it previously in December 2021). Pray that they will soon recover from fatigue and tiredness
	<i>TearFund works with many poor communities across the world. They especially work through local churches and agencies</i>

9th	The League of Pastors, a network of church leaders in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, is working on peacebuilding and conflict-resolution skills. Pray that their influence will improve relations in their communities
10th	Many families have left Port-au-Prince due to increasing street violence. Pastor Philippe welcomed 15 people into his house and has been hosting them for several months.
11th	Willy, a Tearfund Peacebuilding Champion from Bujumbura in Burundi says, “ I would like you to pray for our work fostering peace, social cohesion and development in my country”
12th	In Mianga, central Nigeria, violence escalated in summer 2021, forcing thousands of people from their homes. Pray for an end to attacks and kidnappings by armed groups
	<i>Our CMS Link Missionaries Tim and Kate Lee helped to set up JigSaw Kids Ministries in Manila (Philippines). Please pray-</i>
13th	Jigsaw’s new van has arrived! Pray that it will enable the work of delivering thousands of packs containing Bible materials, food and craft items needed by poor people so they can make clothing to sell
14th	Tim had planned to visit Manila in October but this had to be postponed to January due to the death of his aunt. Instead, Tim has been holding Zoom meetings at 3 am UK time to get urgent things organised
15th	For the last two plus years Jigsaw has not used any buildings for their ministry except Jigsaw’s central office. Now there is a big challenge to re-find spaces and buildings to use. In some places where Jigsaw worked the buildings we used or rented no longer exist. Prayers please.
16th	Distribution of weekly packs stopped for a month due to lack of funds. It started again in November, including meal bags. Pray that funds will stretch to all 2000 children and young people

	<i>Ralph and Dagmar Baron teach in a school in India. Please pray about these matters</i>
17th	Pray for a visa for Cosmas and his family so they can travel to India and he can teach in the school
18th	Dagmar is recovering from influenza and Ralph has continuing monitoring of his heart condition , for which he needs to visit a nearby town
19th	Creativity and good organisation in teaching classes with a very wide range of ability levels
20th	That God will continue to send students, short term volunteers and staff of his choosing and to his glory
	<i>Mission Aviation Fellowship fly medical personnel, supplies and missionaries to far-flung, often inaccessible settlements.</i>
21st	Angry protestors in Haiti set fire to two MAF planes. Pray for protection for MAF personnel living in dangerous areas
22nd	Praise the Lord for the re-opening of the airstrip in remote Vanimo in Papua New Guinea. Pray for MAF as they deliver books and other educational supplies, helping local children to learn.
23rd	In northern Kenya the nomadic Rendille people worship spirits and the inanimate objects around them. Give thanks that through the love and care shown to them in the name of Jesus, there has been an openness to the gospel. Pray for the MAF flights that enable missionaries to share Jesus with the Rendille

24th	Christ is the Answer Ministries shares the Gospel in some of the hardest to reach corners of Kenya. Pray for MAF's partnership with this organisation which enables remote communities to experience the life-changing power of Jesus' birth, death and resurrection
	<i>The Bible Society's Bible-a-month club is delivering Bible resources in China</i>
25th	Restrictions on religious activity have tightened in China and city-wide Covid lockdowns have closed churches, but that hasn't stopped Bible mission
26th	Pray for the good health of Bible workers in China, many of whom work long hours for little pay as they try to reach as many Christians as possible
27th	Bible Society theologian Dr Simon Wong's new book "A Panorama of Chinese Bibles" looks likely to get permission to be published inside China. Pray that the book may be effective in witness
28th	Pray that more Christian books will receive publishing permission in China
	<i>Church Mission Society</i>
29th	Pray for mission partners Jen and Kevin Cable who are working to re-open the historic Anglican church in Jaffa, Israel
30th	Mission partner Alison Giblett chose to stay in Ukraine following the outbreak of war, in solidarity with local partners Anya and Valery and their church, the Tabernacle of the Living God. Now that they have returned to Kyiv, Alison, Anya, Valery and others from the church are bringing support, encouragement and practical help to people whose lives have been devastated
31st	"Thank God for the children's ministry work in Imvepi refugee settlement", writes local partner Sam Malish working in Sudanese refugee camps. Pray for Sam and the team to have the resources and permissions to expand their ministry and connect with more refugees

Goodbye and Hello

In January 2023, Christ Church will be saying '**Goodbye**' to two of our Mission Partners:

Jonathan Beesigomwe, with his wife Robinah, will be retiring in July 2023, after 30 years of service in Botswana. Jonathan has been the Managing Director for Family Connections and Bows and Arrows, working with organisations such as the Evangelical Fellowship of Botswana, in HIV education and prevention of HIV-AIDS, to bring God's Word to children and families across Africa. Jonathan & Robinah will be returning to their homeland – Uganda.

Mircea Pestean, who works with Marantha Missions, was first introduced to Christ Church in 2016 when Kieran McKnight (one of our previous Children's' & Young People's Workers) went to NW Romania to help with a Summer Bible & Music Camp for impoverished Gypsy children. Marantha Missions was established in Romania, in 2000, and now comprises more than 30 Romanian and Gypsy churches, led by 19 Pastors. Mircea Pestean is a Baptist Pastor with oversight of six churches in local Gypsy villages.

We will be saying '**Hello**' to two more couples serving God in Africa and South Asia:

Paul and Elizabeth Makau were involved in training, discipling and mentoring church leaders in the UK for a long time. Paul led the campus of a Bible College, and Elizabeth studied Christian Leadership and missional courses while working as a nurse in the NHS. The Makau family moved to Kenya in August 2022 to join the African Inland Mission (AIM) team, working at the Africa International University (AIU) in Nairobi. AIU is a private Christian university that offers Christ-centred leadership training to church leaders. During term time their twin children, Daniel and Grace, attend Rift Valley Academy, AIM's Christian boarding school for missionary children, in central Kenya. Daniel and Grace have attended several Nefyn Bible Camps with which Andy Stone is very involved. This is where our link with Paul and Elizabeth started. *(continued)*

Answered prayers

Because Jigsaw is an outreach ministry, each day going out into places where there are no buildings or centres that Jigsaw can base themselves in, the Jigsaw van is both central and vital to our ministry. Taking teams and all that is needed for each ministry to the spaces and places in the urban poor and street communities each day is a vital part of our ministry and needs a Jigsaw van. Our first Jigsaw van came to the end of its work a few years ago and the second Jigsaw van limped on over the last year, but we knew we needed a new van if Jigsaw was to continue its ministry, so we prayed and appealed and now the van is with us.

Keele's month of welcoming students

This year Keele CU decided to spread out their events over the month rather than cramming them all in one week. They had a combination of social and evangelistic events, which meant that there was something for everyone! It was so encouraging to see so many student come along (where we ran out of food twice!).

While there are plenty of stories to share from Freshers Week, one particular highlight was with "Peter" (name changed), a Buddhist student who has been coming along the past year to CU events (you might remember him from previous prayer letters!). He came along to the lunch bar talk "What does it take to find satisfaction?", and after the talk he spoke to the speaker, Becky and me. He shared how he has recently been thinking deeply about that question, and while he didn't feel that he had found his answer yet. So he asked us if we could pray for him to find satisfaction in God. So we did! While he said he doesn't yet think he's a Christian, he said he will keep considering it and hopefully find an answer one day. Please continue to be praying for "Peter" to know Jesus himself and that he might find true satisfaction in him!

Staffs and Harper Adams

In October, Staffordshire CU were unable to do the few evangelistic events they had planned to do, due to issues with being able to provide food. The SU also began to stop societies from being able to hand out physical flyers, and as such it meant they struggled to advertise events well. Perhaps as a result of these struggles, Staffs were only able to welcome 3 new students.

While it's been a bit discouraging for Staffs, please be praying that they could continue to trust in God and help them come up with creative ways for them to continue to reach out to other students. Please pray for wisdom for myself as I support them in that too!

Harper Adams started this year with only a handful of members, and was able to welcome around 20 freshers in their first CU main meeting! I've been regularly meeting with Harper CU President, Matt, and we'd been praying hard for enough new students to begin to start more outreach events at Harper this year, so it's a massive answer to prayer!
